Lecture 03: References in APA Style (7 Ed.)

1. Definition

Reference entries equal Works Cited list in MLA style. It should include all the sources paraphrased or quoted in the students 'papers (from a simple essay up to a master dissertation, doctoral thesis, or an academic article). APA reference page should meet the following requirements:

- ➤ The word References should be inserted in bold at the top of the page (centered) as a heading.
- ➤ Reference entries should be ordered alphabetically and double-spaced.
- ➤ A hanging indent of half an inch (1.27cm) should be followed after the first line of each reference entry.
- ➤ The references list should only include sources cited in the paper: consulted sources, personal communications, and common knowledge should not be included.

2. Creating APA References Entries

Unlike MLA Style (8 ed.), APA Style relies on a template-based format. That means almost all types of documentation have a specific form that students should follow. Students should ask these questions when thinking of creating references entries to identify the reference elements:

- \triangleright Who is the author of this work? ==) Author.
- ➤ When was the work first published? ==) Date.
- ➤ What is the title of this work? ==) Title.
- ➤ Where can I get a copy of this work? ==) Source location (publisher, Journal, DOI, Website, etc.)

So, the general format of an APA reference entry is as follows:

Author's family name, Initials of the first name, and the middle name if it exists. (Publication Date). Title. Source.

For example,

Fowler, R. (2022). Understanding Language. Taylor & Francis.

As far as punctuation is concerned, a period is used to separate reference elements (Author and Date, etc.). In contrast, commas are used to separate between one element's parts, as shown in the example (family name and the initials of the first name).

To determine the proper format for a particular source, students are required to identify the source type (books, e-books, book chapters, journal articles, etc.) and then use the appropriate template of that type as shown below:

Source type	Template and example
Book	Author's last name, first and middle name initials. (publication year). Title in italics. publisher name.
> Single author	Fowler, R. (2022). Understanding language. Taylor & Francis.
book 	Landau, B., & Gleitman, L.R. (1985). Language and experience
> Two more	evidence from the blind child. Harvard university press.
author's book	Rhodewalt, F. (Ed).(2008). Personality and social behavior Psychology press.
> Edited book	Allen, G.M., & Tozzer, A. M. (1910). Animal figures in the Mayor codices. Salem http://www.GutenbergOrg/ebooks/19042
> E-book	Levi-Strauss, C. (1971). Totem and caste. In F. E. Katz (ed.) Contemporary sociological theory (pp.82-89). Random house.
➤ Book	If the book chapter is located online and has DOI, it should be added to the reference.
chapter Journal Article	Author last name, First name Initial .(publication year) Articl title. Journal Title, Volume (issue), page numbers. DOI

	Note that APA 7 th edition allowed the citation of a source written with up to 20 authors.

(Website if online or page if it is a hard copy) Harries, J. (2022, May 29). Want to see where Britan's political future will be decided?
